

## Donald "Don" Clair Bogh

Sept. 16, 1918-March 16, 2010

East Portland resident Donald "Don" Clair Bogh, 91, died Tuesday, March 16, in Clackamas.

A funeral service will be held at 11 a.m. Monday, March 22, at Bateman Carroll Funeral Home, 520 W. Powell Blvd. A burial with military honors will follow at 1:30 p.m. at Willamette National Cemetery, 11800 S.E. Mount Scott Blvd., Portland.

Don was born Sept. 16, 1918, in Ringsted, Iowa, to Christian and Katherine Bogh, the youngest of eight children.

He served in the Air Force during World War II. After the war, he lived in East St. Louis, Ill.

In 1945, he married Pearl O'Banion. They divorced. Don later married Juanita "Jo" Drage.

Don worked in construction before becoming a longtime real estate broker in the Portland area. He was involved in politics and campaigned for both John and Robert Kennedy, was a delegate representative to the Democratic National Convention, and served on the citizen action committee for the East Portland police and on the Multnomah County Planning Committee.

Don was a Gateway Booster and Portland Rotary member, a member of the Elks and Moose organizations and of the Toastmasters. Don also served on the Portland Board of Realtors and was a past president of the Danish Brotherhood.

His daughter, Gwen Carter, and seven siblings preceded him in death.

Survivors include his wife, Jo; daughters, Donna-Lynn Kublick of Portland, Wendy Schomann of Troutdale and Valerie Simpson of Gresham; brother, Christian Bogh of Portland; 13 grandchildren; and

six great-grandchildren.
