Don was born in Ringsted, Iowa, to Christian and Katherine (Kling) Bogh, the youngest of eight children, and the last to go.

Don served his country in the U.S. Air Force during World War II. After the war, he lived in St. Louis, Ill. Don married Pearl O'Banion in 1945. Later he married Juanita "Jo" Drage. Don worked in construction before being a longtime real estate broker in the Portland area.

Don was deeply involved in politics. He campaigned for John and Robert Kennedy, was a delegate representative at the Democratic National Convention and was on the citizen action committee for the East Portland Police Department and the Multnomah County Planning Committee.

Don was a Gateway Booster, a member of the Portland Rotary, Elks, Moose and Toastmaster organizations, on the Portland Board of Realtors and was past president of the Danish Brotherhood.

Don's family meant everything to him. Survivors include his daughters, Donna-Lynn Kublick, Wendy Schomann and Valerie Simpson; brother, Christian Bogh; 13 grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren. His daughter, Gwen Carter, preceded him in death.

A funeral will be at 11 a.m. Monday, March 22, 2010, in Bateman Carroll Funeral Home in Gresham. A concluding graveside service with military honors will be in Willamette National Cemetery in Portland.
